Final TPM

We had our final TPM in Sofia, Bulgaria. We shared how each of our partners created their gardens and carried out their workshops, sharing photos from each country.

We discussed dissemination activities as well as the evaluation from our participants. We had a short but very fruitful meeting, which was full of interesting information.



Workshops in France

In total, the workshops brought together 38 participants and 14 trainers and facilitators. The participants declared in their large majority (87%) that they enjoyed the workshops. Regarding the knowledge gained through the workshop, 62% of the responders declared that they learnt something new during them. Also, they mentioned that they also gained new skills, especially in communication, patience and teamwork. Environmental and nutritional knowledge was also declared by the respondents. Finally, 90% of the participants would like to come back to this type of workshop and the same percentage will recommend it to other people.



Workshops in Greece

Our workshops, designed to develop key soft skills like teamwork and communication, and have successfully engaged local residents. We engaged around 25 people in the workshops, with some people passing by and stopping to take part and some dedicated volunteers for each and every one. By focusing on a bustling area, we've utilized our workshop as a platform for active environmental advocacy, and encouraging passersby to learn about and participate in our sustainable activities. Through this approach, our workshops is transforming our cityscape, fostering a green, skilled, and aware community. We shared information about the project, its goals and what we've created as well as had an interactive aspect to each workshop, taking care of the soil, planting different plants and fertilising them.



Workshops in Turkey

-We worked with more than 60 people throughout these workshops. The participants were from different ages and social status, we included everyone who wanted to take part in the workshops. We separated the participants into groups and assigned them the tasks of fertilizing the soil, digging holes for the seeds, and planting them. We also discussed how to take care of the plants and what are their qualities. As a result we have created both private and public gardens and have worked with a school, raising the awareness and knowledge of the future generation as well as adults today.



Workshops in Bulgaria

We partnered with one local volunteer group and one local school in the city of Burgas. We worked with around 45 people, including parents, teachers and children from all over the city. We created 4 mini gardens, which will be sustained for a long time. Out of the evaluation we understood that more than 65% enjoyed the workshops and have learned something new. We planted herbs, fruits and vegetables, teaching how to take care of each kind of plant, as well as how to fertilize the soil and what to use the plants for after they have been harvested. We created posters which were left for the school so that the teachers and students can use them. We also showed the project manual and shared it with the school headmaster.
